



Strategic Plan to Transition Millage Rate to the City of Stonecrest for Public Works

What is Millage Rate for Stonecrest?

In 2020, property taxes to be collected for Parks & Recreation services that began in August 2019

- One Mill for City of Stonecrest: **\$1,680,866**
- Millage Rate Transferred from DeKalb:
(Parks & Rec, only) **1.438**
- Gross Revenue for 1.438 mills: **\$2,433,257**
- **Estimated Revenue:**
(Revenue with 1 mill homestead exemption) **\$1,860,760**



Public Hearing Safety during COVID-19 Pandemic

(can participate virtually (using email) or attend in person)
- The Public Hearing will be broadcast using **YouTube Live**

Public Hearing Safety during COVID-19 Pandemic

- To make comments **virtually**:
 - Submit comments to City Clerk **via email** at least one hour prior to advertised Public Hearing time
 - The City Clerk will read the **first 3 minutes** of the public comments into the record during the Public Hearing

Public Hearing Safety during COVID-19 Pandemic

- To make comments **in person**:
 - Come to City Hall (all speakers will be socially distanced in hallway outside of Council Chambers)
 - Each speaker will be given a temperature check with a digital thermometer (temperature must be **below 100.4 degrees** to access Council Chambers)
 - Each speaker will be granted access to **laptop in Council Chambers** running the ZOOM session for the **Stonecrest Millage Rate Public Hearing**
 - Each speaker will be given 3 minutes to make comments
 - Each speaker will be escorted away from City Hall in order to minimize contact with other speakers
 - The speaker area around ZOOM laptop will be disinfected between each speaker
