GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. Invitation to Bid Submission Requirements

To be entitled to consideration, bids must be submitted electronically at <https://www.biddirect.com/georgia/cityofstonecrest>

2. Preparation of Bids

- 2.1 If there is any question whatsoever regarding any portion of the instructions or specifications, it shall be the Supplier's responsibility to seek clarification immediately from the City of Stonecrest Purchasing Department during the question period stated herein. **It shall be the Supplier's responsibility to check <https://www.biddirect.com/georgia/cityofstonecrest> for any/all addendum(s).** Answer(s) to all questions will be given after the deadline for questions has expired and posted to the City of Stonecrest Bidnet portal.
- 2.2 The apparent silence of the specifications and any supplement specifications as to any details or the omission from it of a detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning that only the best commercial practices are to prevail and that only materials of first quality and correct type, size and design are to be used. All workmanship is to be of the best quality. All interpretations of specifications shall be made upon the basis of this statement.
- 2.3 No reimbursement will be made by the City for any costs incurred prior to a formal notice to proceed should an award of contract result from this solicitation. The proposal must be signed by an official authorized to bind the Supplier.
- 2.4 The City of Stonecrest desires delivery of the material or services specified at the earliest possible time after the date of award. An unreasonable delivery proposal may be cause for disqualification of a bid. Each bidder shall state a definite time and avoid using the terms ASAP or approximately so many days.
- 2.5 The City reserves the right to accept or reject any and all responses and to waive technicalities as deemed to be in the best interest of the City. The City reserves the right to request additional information from a respondent(s) as deemed necessary to analyze responses.
- 2.6 Any variation from the specifications must be clearly stated by the bidding company in writing and submitted with the proposal.

3. Category of Award

The following bid shall be awarded to one "responsive" bidder on a total lump sum price basis. Unit prices and extensions will be verified, and totals checked. Unit price extension and net total must be shown.

4. City of Stonecrest Non-Discrimination

The City does not discriminate on the basis of race, age, sex, national origin, religion, or disabilities and is an equal opportunity employer. Minority and women-owned businesses are encouraged to apply.

5. Business Enterprises

The City strongly encourages Small Business firms to participate in this ITB.

6. Insurance

Within ten (10) days of execution of this Agreement, and at all times that this Contract is in force, the Contractor shall obtain, maintain and furnish the City Certificates of Insurance from licensed companies doing business in the State of Georgia with an A.M. Best Rating A-6 or higher and acceptable to the City covering:

A. Statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance

a. Employers Liability:

Bodily Injury by Accident - \$1,000,000 each accident

Bodily Injury by Disease - \$1,000,000 policy limit

Bodily Injury by Disease - \$1,000,000 each employee

B. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance

Owner's and Contractor's Protective

a. \$ 500,000 limit of liability

b. Comprehensive form covering all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles.

D. Umbrella Liability Insurance

a. \$1,000,000 limit of liability

b. Coverage at least as broad as primary coverage as outlined under Items 1, 2 and 3 above.

- E. The City of Stonecrest, Georgia, and its subcontractors and affiliated companies, their officers, directors, employees shall be named on the Certificates of Insurance as additional insured and endorsed onto the policies for Comprehensive General Liability, Automobile Liability and Umbrella Liability insurance maintained pursuant to this Contract in connection with liability of the City of Stonecrest and their affiliated companies and their officers, directors and employees arising out of Contractor's operations. Copies of the endorsements shall be furnished to the City upon execution of this Agreement. Such insurance is primary insurance and shall contain a Severability of Interest clause as respects each insured. Such policies shall be non-cancelable except on thirty (30) days written notice to the City. Any separate insurance maintained in force by the additional insured named above shall not contribute to the insurance extended by Contractor's insurer(s) under this additional insured provision.

General Requirements and Qualifications

A copy of the City's standard contract is attached as an exhibit to this ITB. Once the ITB is submitted, the material terms of this contract ARE NOT NEGOTIABLE. Failure to agree to the terms of the Agreement after award of bid shall authorize the City to reject bidder.

Other Considerations

1. All materials submitted in response to this ITB become the property of the City and will be returned only at the option of the City. The City reserves the right to use any or all ideas presented in any response to the ITB, and selection or rejection of the proposal does not affect this right.
2. Until the City acts formally to approve a contract, and until such contract is signed by both parties, the City is not legally obligated in any respect.
 - 1) The successful responder must maintain all licenses, permits, certifications, and other authorizations necessary to provide the needed services as required by federal, state, or local laws.
 - 2) The successful responder will be required to indemnify, defend and hold the City, its officers and employees harmless from and against all losses, claims, suits or judgments, including payment of attorneys' fees and costs, incurred or asserted against the City as a result of or arising from the firm's negligent acts or omissions. This provision of a contract resulting from this ITB will survive the expiration or termination of the contract.
 - 3) During the Selection Process, the City reserves the right for any reason deemed appropriate by the City: to waive portions of the ITB; to waive any minor informality in the bids; to reject all bids; to terminate the ITB; and to issue a new ITB.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Award of Contract

The Purchasing Department will open the bids and prepare a register of those responders submitting proposals. All proposals shall remain firm for forty-five (45) calendar days after the bid opening.

Before awarding the ITB, the City may request additional information from Responders. The City reserves the right to reject any and all Proposals if it determines that the criteria set forth has not been met or for any other reason in its sole discretion.

Bid Rejections

The City reserves the right to accept or reject any and all responses and to waive technicalities as deemed to be in the best interest of the City.

Bids will be rejected from any party (as an individual or as part of a partnership or entity) who:

- Is delinquent in the payment of property or other taxes with Stonecrest;
- Is delinquent in the payment of a loan(s) with the City;
- Has had property acquired through foreclosure or a judgment within the past ten (10) years.
- Has outstanding judgments or debts owed to the City;
- Has been convicted of a felony that affects property or neighborhood stability, health, safety or welfare.

Public records and tax and court records will also be checked prior to award of contract. If these conditions exist, the City may terminate the Contract.

Disclaimer/Reservation of Rights

The City does not make representations or warranties, express or implied, as to the accuracy and/or completeness of the information provided in this ITB.

The City reserves the right to extend the deadline for submission of Bids, to request supplementary information, to conduct interviews with any or all of the bidder's submitting proposals, to waive minor informalities, and to reject any or all proposals, in whole or in part, if in its sole judgment the best interests of the City would be served in doing so. The city will reject any and all proposals when required to do so by applicable law.

I. INTRODUCTION, BACKGROUND, AND ITB PROCESS

Introduction

The City of Stonecrest, Georgia (the “City”) is seeking competitive bids for ITB 24-25 Construction of the Fairington Road Sidewalk from responsible bidders.

Background

This project includes construction of 5 ft. sidewalk at a single location within the city limit of City of Stonecrest, Georgia under a Georgia Department of Transportation Encroachment Permit.

Invitation to Bid Process

This solicitation is an Invitation to Bid (ITB). In using this method for solicitation, we are asking the marketplace for its best effort in seeking a “best value” solution to our requirement. The bids(s) submitted by the Supplier will be evaluated by an evaluation committee. Suppliers should make their best effort to satisfy the requirements at their best price because a contract may be awarded based on the initial evaluation. Essentially, if a Supplier’s proposal is not evaluated as having a chance for contract award because of the content of the proposal and/or the price, the proposal will be removed from the competitive process to save time and money for both the Supplier and City of Stonecrest.

II. SCOPE OF WORK

Contract Duration:

Ninety (90) calendar days.

Project Description and Scope:

The City of Stonecrest is seeking qualified and experienced contractors for sidewalk construction.

This project includes construction of five foot (5ft). Sidewalk at a single location within the city limits of City of Stonecrest, Georgia under a Georgia Department of Transportation Encroachment Permit # A-0089-011341-7 (to be secured by the City of Stonecrest).

Location: Construction of 2,275 +/- L.F. 5 ft. wide and 4 in. thick on the south side of Fairington Road / U.S. 278 / S.R. 12 from an area approximately 900 L.F. +/- to the west of the centerline of Willowrick Drive to a point just beyond existing MARTA sign to the east of Tiburon Drive (see photos below).

General Information

Although the City may assist in permitting by providing contact information and requirements, the contractor is responsible for determining which, if any, permits or applications are required; and applying and obtaining the proper permits that may be required based on City or County Ordinances.

The selected contractor shall be responsible for and must adhere to any local or state building code, safety and/or ADA requirements that need to be met.

City Stonecrest Engineering Department reserves the right to utilize the Contractor's name, image, and likeness with regard to publicity on the project and disclosure of all work and payments being done. This work is funded with public funds and will be completely transparent to the public and will be promoted.

Any contractor who has not previously done business with the City and is not listed as a current vendor must supply a current W-9, E-Verify Affidavit and Certificate of Insurance that complies with the City Purchasing Policy and will be required to submit a *Performance Bond* in an amount equal to the total cost of the quote. As per City Purchasing regulations, a letter of credit may be substituted for a Performance Bond, depending on the institution, and reported credit worthiness.

The contractor shall execute the work according to and meet the requirements of the following:

- Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT) Specifications, Standards, and Details;
- The Contract Documents including but not limited to the scope of work, plans, and specifications;
- City of Stonecrest ordinances and regulations
- OSHA standards and guidelines
- MUTCD Guidelines
- Any other applicable codes, laws and regulations including but not limited to Section 45-10-20 through 45-10-28 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act, Drug-Free Workplace Act, and all applicable requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. The contractor will be responsible for providing all labor, materials, and equipment necessary to perform the work. This is a unit price bid. Payment will be made based on actual work completed.

The contractor is responsible for inspecting the jobsite prior to submitting a bid. No change orders will be issued for differing site conditions.

Materials must come from GDOT approved sources. The contractor will be required to submit in writing a list of proposed sources of materials. When required representative samples will be taken for examination and testing prior to approval. The materials used in the work shall meet all quality requirements of the contract. Materials will not be considered as finally accepted until all tests, including any to be taken from the finished work have been completed and evaluated. Standard

Specification 106 – Control of Materials will be used as a guide. All materials will be tested according to the GDOT Sampling, Testing, and Inspection Manual by an approved consultant/lab hired by the City.

The successful bidder must have verifiable experience at construction of similar projects in accordance with these specifications. Bidder shall provide at least three examples and reference information (including company name, project name, contact name, phone number and email address) demonstrating experience successfully completing projects of similar scope.

10% retainage will be withheld from the total amount due the contractor until Final Acceptance of work is issued by the City. The City will inspect the work as it progresses.

PROSECUTION AND PROGRESS

The Contractor will mobilize with sufficient forces such that all construction identified as part of this contract shall be substantially completed within 90 days of Notice to Proceed. The contractor will be considered substantially complete when all work required by this contract has been completed (excluding final punch list work).

Upon Notice of Award, the Contractor will be required to submit a Progress Schedule.

Normal workday for this project shall be 7:00AM to 7:00PM and the normal workweek shall be Monday through Friday. Lane closures are limited to the hours of 9:00AM to 4:00PM. The City will consider extended workdays or workweeks upon written request by the Contractor on a case-by-case basis. No work will be allowed on national holidays (i.e. Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, etc.).

The work will require bidder to provide all labor, administrative forces, equipment, materials and other incidental items to complete all required work. The City shall perform a Final Inspection upon substantial completion of the work. The contractor will be allowed to participate in the Final Inspection. All repairs shall be completed by the contractor at contractor's expense prior to issuance of Final Acceptance.

A one (1) year maintenance bond will be required. The selected contractor will be responsible for the maintenance of materials for one (1) year including watering and replacement of dead materials. The City will conduct an inspection at the end of the warranty period. The contractor will complete any Punch List work within 10 calendar days.

The contractor shall provide all material, labor, and equipment necessary to perform the work

without delay until final completion.

The contractor shall provide a project progress schedule prior to or at the preconstruction meeting. This schedule should accurately represent the intended work and cannot be vague or broad such as listing every road in the contract.

The contractor shall submit a two-week advance schedule every **Friday by 2:00p.m.**, detailing scheduled activities for the following week.

PERMITS AND LICENSES

GDOT Encroachment Permit ID: A-089-011341-7 will be provided to the contractor. The contractor shall procure any other permits and licenses, pay all charges, taxes and fees, and give all notices necessary and incidental to the due and lawful prosecution of the work.

MATERIALS

The materials used in the work shall meet all quality requirements of the contract. All materials will meet appropriate GDOT specifications. Materials quality control test types will meet GDOT specifications at a frequency equal to or exceeding that set by those specifications. Contractor will be responsible for replacing any work performed with material from rejected sample lot at no cost to the City.

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION

The contractor shall be responsible for installing variable message signs at each end of the project one week prior to commencement of work requiring lane closure. Payment for this will be included in the item for Traffic Control. The contractor shall be responsible for installing lane closure and construction signage per MUTCD guidelines. Payment for this will be included in the item for

Traffic Control. Properties requiring driveway closures be notified no less than one week prior to said closures.

EXISTING CONDITIONS / DEVIATION OF QUANTITIES

All information given in this ITB concerning quantities, scope of work, existing conditions, etc. is for information purposes only. It is the Contractor's responsibility to inspect the project site to verify existing conditions and quantities prior to submitting their bid. This is a Unit Price bid and no payment will be made for additional work without prior written approval from the City. At no time will Contractor proceed with work outside the prescribed scope of services for which additional payment will be requested without the written authorization of the City.

The City reserves the right to add, modify, or delete quantities. The City may also elect to add or eliminate certain work locations at its discretion. The Contractor will not be entitled to any

adjustment of unit prices or any other form of additional compensation because of adjustments made to quantities and/or work locations. Contractor will be paid for actual in-place quantities completed and accepted for pay items listed in the Bid Schedule. All other work required by this ITB, plans, specs, standards, etc. but not specifically listed in the Bid Schedule shall be considered “incidental work” and included in the bid prices for items on the Bid Schedule.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The contractor shall, at all times, conduct their work so as to assure the least possible obstruction of traffic.

The safety and convenience of the general public and the residents along the roadway and the protection of persons and property shall be provided for by the contractor as specified in the State of Georgia, Department of Transportation Standard Specifications Sections 104.05, 107.09, and 150.

Traffic whose origin and destination is within the limits of the project shall be provided ingress and egress at all times unless otherwise specified by the City. The ingress and egress includes entrances and exits via driveways at various properties, and access to the intersecting roads and streets. The contractor shall maintain sufficient personnel and equipment (including flaggers and traffic control signing) on the project at all times, particularly during inclement weather, to ensure that ingress and egress are safely provided when and where needed.

Two-way traffic shall be maintained at all times, unless otherwise specified or approved by the City. In the event of an emergency situation, the Contractor shall provide access to emergency vehicles and/or emergency personnel through or around the construction area. Any pavement damaged by such an occurrence will be repaired by the Contractor at no additional cost to the City. The contractor shall furnish, install and maintain all necessary and required barricades, signs and other traffic control devices in accordance with the MUTCD and DOT specifications, and take all necessary precautions for the protection of the workers and safety of the public.

All existing signs, markers and other traffic control devices removed or damaged during construction operations will be reinstalled or replaced at the contractor's expense, except as otherwise called for in the plans. At no time will contractor remove regulatory signing which may cause a hazard to the public.

PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY AND LANDSCAPE

The contractor shall be responsible for the preservation of all public and private property, crops, fish ponds,

trees, monuments, highway signs and markers, fences, grassed and sodded areas, etc. along and adjacent to the highway, road or street, and shall use every precaution necessary to prevent damage or injury thereto,

unless the removal, alteration, or destruction of such property is provided for under the contract.

When or where any direct or indirect damage or injury is done to public or private property by or on account of any act, omission, neglect or misconduct in the execution of the work, or in consequence of the non-execution thereof by the contractor, he shall restore, at his/her own expense, such property to a condition similar or equal to that existing before such damage or injury was done, by repairing, rebuilding or otherwise restoring as may be directed, or she/he shall make good such damage or injury in an acceptable manner. The contractor shall correct all disturbed areas before retainage will be released.

ADJUSTING UTILITY STRUCTURES TO GRADE

Any sewer manholes and water valves are to be adjusted by the DeKalb County Department of Watershed Management. The contractor shall coordinate required utility adjustments with the engineering consultants.

THERMOPLASTIC PAVEMENT MARKINGS (where applicable)

Final pavement markings shall match the signing & marking plans including center lines, lane lines, turn arrows, crosswalks, stop bars, etc. unless specifically directed otherwise by the City. Final pedestrian crosswalk markings shall adhere to the latest standards. Pavement marking materials shall meet GDOT standard specifications and be on the qualified products list. Temporary pavement markings, where required, shall be included in the pay item for thermoplastic pavement markings. There is no separate pay item for temporary pavement markings.

CLEANUP

All restoration and clean-up work shall be performed daily. Operations shall be suspended if the contractor fails to accomplish restoration and clean-up within an acceptable period of time. Asphalt and other debris shall be removed from gutters, sidewalks, yards, driveways, etc. Failure to perform clean-up activities may result in suspension of the work.

SAFETY

Beginning with mobilization and ending with acceptance of work, the contractor shall be responsible for providing a clean and safe work environment at the project site. The contractor shall comply with all OSHA regulations as they pertain to this project.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. Remove and properly dispose of all demolished asphalt and concrete.
2. All disturbed or damaged grassing and landscaping on backside of sidewalk is to match surrounding conditions. Cost to be included in the "GRADING COMPLETE" bid item.
3. All grass strips between back of curb and front of sidewalk shall be Sod.
4. All costs for landscaping removal and demo of existing pavement/curb & gutter for the project is to be included in the "GRADING COMPLETE" quantity for the project.
5. For all utilities that can't be adjusted by the contractor, coordination shall be conducted with the proper utility company.
6. Contractor shall be required to meet all GDOT lane closure requirements. Signage and all other forms of traffic control shall be included in the "TRAFFIC CONTROL" quantity for the project.
7. For all driveway aprons that require modification, ensure there is proper drainage toward the curb & gutter line.
8. Yellow ADA detectable warning surfaces should be included in "CONC SIDEWALK, 8 IN" for all ADA ramp construction.

SUBCONTRACTOR

Any contractor utilizing a subcontractor must submit a proposed list of subcontractors and a Subcontractor Affidavit (form provided).

TIME AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

The Contractor shall not proceed to furnish such services, and the City shall not become obligated to pay for same until a written authorization to proceed ("Notice to Proceed") has been sent to the Contractor from the City. The Contractor shall commence the Work no later than ten (10) calendar days after the effective date of the Notice to Proceed and shall achieve Substantial Completion of the Work, as hereinafter defined, no later than ninety (90) calendar days from Notice to Proceed, in accordance with the Contract Documents. The number of calendar days from the date on which the Work is permitted to proceed, through the date set forth for Substantial Completion, shall constitute the Contract Time. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT SERVICES

This Professional Services Agreement (“Agreement”) is made and entered into this day of _____, 20__, by and between the CITY OF STONECREST, GEORGIA ("City"), and _____ (“Contractor”).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Contractor is engaged in the business of providing sidewalk construction.

WHEREAS, Contractor submitted a response to the City’s Invitation to Bid for Sidewalk Construction which was selected by the City as the most responsive bidder;

WHEREAS, the City desires to engage Contractor, and Contractor agrees to render certain technical advice and professional services to the City pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, conditions and covenants set forth herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. **SERVICES.** Contractor agrees to provide professional services to the City as detailed in **Exhibit A** (“Services”). If any services to be performed are not specifically listed in Exhibit A or herein, but are reasonably necessary to accomplish the purpose of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to perform such services at the direction and approval of the City Manager or his/her designee. In the event of any conflict between the terms of Exhibit A and this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall control.
2. **COMPENSATION.** In consideration for Services, the City shall pay to Contractor a fee not to exceed the amounts indicated in **Exhibit B** (“Cost Proposal”). The City agrees to pay Contractor’s invoices within thirty (30) days of receiving same. As the City is a local government entity and thus exempt from sales taxation, notwithstanding the terms of the proposal, Contractor acknowledges that the City shall not be responsible for payment of any sales taxes on any invoices submitted for the services provided under this Agreement.
3. **TERM.** This Agreement shall commence on the date all parties have executed this Agreement (“Effective Date”) and shall terminate absolutely without further obligation on the part of the City on _____ (“Term”).
4. **RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES.**
 - (a) **Independent Contractors.** Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to create any relationship other than that of independent contractor between the City and Contractor. This Agreement shall not constitute, create, or otherwise imply an employment, joint venture, partnership, agency or similar arrangement between the City and Contractor. It is expressly agreed that Contractor is acting as an independent contractor and not as an employee in providing the Services under this Agreement.
 - (b) **Employee Benefits.** Contractor shall not be eligible for any benefit available to employees of the City including, but not limited to, workers’ compensation insurance, state disability insurance, unemployment insurance, group health and life insurance, vacation pay, sick pay,

severance pay, bonus plans, pension plans, or savings plans.

- (c) Payroll Taxes. No income, social security, state disability or other federal or state payroll tax will be deducted from payments made to Contractor under this Agreement. Contractor shall be responsible for all FICA, federal and state withholding taxes and workers' compensation coverage for any individuals assigned to perform the Services for the City.

5. **WARRANTY ON SERVICES RENDERED.** The Contractor warrants its Services and workmanship shall be (i) free from defects; (ii) performed as stipulated in the bid/proposal documents and conform to all specifications; (iii) performed by skilled personnel experienced in and capable of doing the kind of work assigned to them; and (iv) performed in accordance to all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, rules and policies. Upon receipt of written notice of a defect, the Contractor shall repair the defect in a timely manner at no expense to the City.

6. **TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT.**

- (a) The City may, subject to the provisions of subparagraph (c) below, by written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate the whole or any part of this Agreement in any one of the following circumstances; (i) if the Contractor fails to perform this Agreement within the time specified herein or any extension thereof; or (ii) if the Contractor fails to perform any of the other provisions of this Agreement, or so fails to make progress as to endanger performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms, and does not cure such failure within a period of ten (10) days after receipt of notice from the City specifying such failure.
- (b) In the event the City terminates this Agreement in whole or in part as provided in subparagraph (a) above, the City may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as the City may deem appropriate, services, similar to those so terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the City for any excess costs for the same, including without limitation all cost and expenses of the type specified in the "WARRANTY" paragraph of this Agreement; provided, that the Contractor shall continue the performance of this Agreement to the extent not terminated hereunder.
- (c) Except with regard to defaults of subcontractors, the Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs if the failure to perform this Agreement arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault of negligence of the Contractor; such causes may include, but are not limited to, acts of God, or of the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, flood, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather, but in every case the failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. If the failure to perform is caused by the default of a subcontractor, and if such default arises out of causes beyond the control of both the Contractor and the subcontractor, and without the fault or negligence of either of them, the Contractor shall not be liable for any excess costs for failure to perform, unless the services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit the Contractor to meet the required delivery schedule. The term "subcontractor" shall mean subcontractor at any tier.
- (d) If, after notice of termination of this Agreement under the provisions of this paragraph, it is determined for any reason that the Contractor was not in default under the provisions above

or that the default was excusable under the provisions of this paragraph, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the notice of termination has been issued pursuant to the "Termination for Convenience" paragraph of this Agreement.

- (e) The rights and remedies of the City provided in this paragraph shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Agreement.
7. **TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE.** The City may at any time by written notice terminate all or any part of this Agreement for the City's convenience. If this Agreement is terminated, in whole or in part, for the City's convenience, the Contractor shall be paid an amount, to be mutually agreed upon, which shall be adequate to cover the actual and reasonable cost paid by the Contractor for the actual goods and labor reasonably used by the Contractor to perform the work under this Agreement to the effective date of termination, plus a reasonable profit thereon; provided that no amount shall be paid to the Contractor for (i) any anticipatory profits related to work under this Agreement not yet performed, or (ii) costs incurred due to the Contractor's failure to terminate work as ordered on the effective date of termination. In no event shall the total amount paid under the provisions of this paragraph exceed the prices set forth in this Agreement for the work terminated.
 8. **DISPUTES.** Pending resolution of any dispute hereunder, the Contractor shall proceed diligently with the performance of work in accordance with the City's direction.
 9. **INDEMNIFICATION.** To the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City and its governing officials, agents, employees, and representatives (collectively, the "City Indemnitees") from and against any and all liabilities, demands, losses, damages, fines, penalties, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees and costs), incurred by any City Indemnitee as a result of or arising out of (i) the wrongful misconduct or negligence (including fraud) of Contractor or its employees, agents, and representatives in performing this Agreement; (ii) a material breach by Contractor of its covenants; or (iii) failure by Contractor or its employees, agents, and representatives to comply with all applicable federal, state, or local law, rule or regulation in connection with services provided under this Agreement. These obligations shall survive termination.
 10. **RISK MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS.** The Contractor shall abide by the City's applicable Risk Management Requirements, attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit C** and incorporated herein by reference.
 11. **STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE AND COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS.**
 - (a) Contractor warrants and represents that it possesses the special skill and professional competence, expertise, and experience to undertake the obligations imposed by this Agreement.
 - (b) Contractor agrees to perform in a diligent, efficient, competent, and skillful manner commensurate with the highest standards of the profession, and to otherwise perform as is necessary to undertake the Services required by this Agreement, including the requirements set forth in the Certification of Sponsor Drug Free Workplace, attached hereto as **Exhibit D** and the Purchasing Policy Addendum attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.
 - (c) Contractor warrants and represents that it will, at all times, observe and comply with all

federal, state, local and municipal laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations, relating to the provision of the Services to be provided by Contractor hereunder or which in any manner affect this Agreement.

12. GEORGIA SECURITY AND IMMIGRATION COMPLIANCE

ACT. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Section 13-10-91, for as long as this Agreement remains in effect, Contractor will be registered with and participate in the federal work authorization program to verify the immigration status of newly hired employees (“e-Verify”). Contractor will execute the O.C.G.A. Section 13-10-91 compliance affidavit on Exhibit F, attached hereto and incorporated herein.

13. THE CITY’S ASSISTANCE AND COOPERATION. During the Contractor’s performance of this Agreement, the City may, but has no obligation to, provide assistance to, or cooperate with, the Contractor in activities that facilitate the proper performance and completion of this Agreement by the Contractor. Such assistance and cooperation may include without limitation: (i) providing engineering or other analysis or advice on correcting problems; (ii) refraining from strict enforcement of time schedule requirements under this Agreement; (iii) permitting use of test materials or documentation not performed or produced under this Agreement. Such assistance or cooperation by the City shall not be construed, and the Contractor agrees that it will not claim that any such assistance or cooperation operates, to relieve the Contractor from complete, proper and punctual performance of all the Contractor’s obligations under this Agreement.

14. WORK ON THE CITY’S DESIGNATED PREMISES. In the event that the Contractor, the Contractor’s employees or agents or the Contractor’s subcontractors enter the City’s designated premises for any reason in connection with this Agreement, the Contractor and such other parties shall observe all security requirements and all safety regulations.

15. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST. Contractor warrants and represents that:

- (a) The Services to be performed hereunder will not create an actual or apparent conflict of interest with any other work it is currently performing.
- (b) Contractor is not presently subject to any agreement with a competitor or with any other party that will prevent Contractor from performing in full accord with this Agreement; and
- (c) Contractor is not subject to any statute, regulation, ordinance or rule that will limit its ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement. The parties agree that Contractor shall be free to accept other work during the term hereof; provided, however, that such other work shall not interfere with the provision of Services hereunder.

16. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. Contractor acknowledges that it may have access to and become acquainted with confidential information, including, but not limited to, any information the disclosure of which is limited by state or federal law. Unless approved in advance in writing or is required to be disclosed by court order, subpoena or by law, neither Contractor nor any of its employees, will disclose, transfer, distribute or allow access to any confidential information of the other party to third parties. These obligations shall survive termination.

17. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTING. The Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or any portion of this Agreement, nor shall the Contractor subcontract goods or completed or substantially completed services purchased hereunder without the prior express written consent

of the City. No assignment or subcontract by the Contractor, including any assignment or subcontract to which the City consents, shall in any way relieve the Contractor from complete and punctual performance of this Agreement, including without limitation all of the Contractor's obligations under the warranty provisions of this Agreement.

- 18. **ATTORNEYS' FEES.** Both parties agree to pay reasonable attorneys' fees to the other party should either party be required to incur attorneys' fees in enforcing the provisions of this Agreement or in the collection of any monies herein required to be paid by the other party.
- 19. **GOVERNING LAW AND CONSENT TO JURISDICTION.** This Agreement is made and entered into in the State of Georgia, and this Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereto shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the State of Georgia without giving effect to the principles of conflicts of laws. The jurisdiction for resolution of any disputes arising from this Agreement shall be in the State Courts of DeKalb County, Georgia.
- 20. **NOTICES.** All notices or other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given when delivered personally in hand, or when mailed by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested with proper postage prepaid, addressed to the appropriate party at the following address or such other address as may be given in writing to the parties:

If to the Contractor:

- 21. **NON-WAIVER.** The failure by either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict performance with every provision of this Agreement.
- 22. **SEVERABILITY.** If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unenforceable for any reason, the unenforceability thereof shall not affect the remainder of the Agreement, which shall remain in full force and effect, and enforceable in accordance with its terms.
- 23. **INTERPRETATION.** The Parties acknowledge that this Agreement and all the terms and conditions herein have been fully reviewed and negotiated by the Parties. Having acknowledged the foregoing, the Parties agree that any principle of construction or rule of law that provides that, in the event of any inconsistency or ambiguity, an agreement shall be construed against the drafter of the agreement shall have no application to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

24. **AMENDMENTS.** Any and all modifications or changes to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the parties to this Agreement.
25. **COUNTERPARTS.** This Agreement may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall constitute the original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same Agreement. PDF signatures shall constitute original signatures.
26. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This Agreement, which includes the exhibits attached hereto, contains the entire agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes and replaces any and all prior discussions, representations and understandings, whether oral or written. In case of conflict between any term of the Contractor's Bid/Proposal and this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall control unless otherwise stated herein.
27. **CAPTIONS.** The captions appearing herein are for convenience of reference only and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement or any clause or provision hereof.
